Guests can say "Good Morning!" with eggs, omelets, and special combinations. House specialties include eggs benedict, breakfast burrito, country sausage gravy and patties over biscuits with two eggs, cinnamon nut bread, French toast, and homemade Belgian waffles and pancakes.

Fresh home-baked muffins include banana nut, blueberry, raisin bran, corn, orange cranberry, chocolate chip, lemon poppy, plus low-fat blueberry and apple cinnamon.
